


Why Are We Here?

ARIN, a nonprofit member-based organization, supports the operation of the Internet through the management of Internet number resources throughout its service region; coordinates the development of policies by the community for the management of Internet Protocol number resources; and advances the Internet through informational outreach.








The ARIN Region includes many Caribbean and North Atlantic islands, Canada, the United States and outlying areas.




IP Address and Autonomous System Number Provisioning Process



It all starts with you...





Many networks first encounter ARIN when they need an AS number for BGP



...Or when they want to get portable IP addresses to avoid renumbering



ARIN's core function is registration of IP addresses and AS numbers to ensure global uniqueness



... and to operate directory services which allow the public to determine to whom the IP addresses and AS numbers are registered

Who sets the rules about resource distribution? The Community!



Three things to remember:

- 1. ARIN staff are <u>prohibited</u> from setting policy
- 2. We facilitate the policy development process (PDP) to enable the community to create & maintain policies
- 3. Fostering an open, transparent, fair, and bottom-up policy process is a key ARIN function



Advisory Council

15 Member Advisory Council

Elected by the membership

5 seats open each election/year Serves in an advisory capacity to the Board on Internet number resource policy and related matters

Forwards consensusbased policy proposals to the Board for ratification



Board of Trustees

7 Member Board of Trustees

6 elected by the membership plus President & CEO – all voting

2 seats open each election/year Ability to appoint an additional voting member for diversity

- Maintain, develop, and enhance functionality of ARIN services as sought by the users and supported by the members
